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BGFA | TOP LEVEL OVERVIEW


- EUR 50 million Energy Access Programme vested by the Government of Sweden, managed by NEFCO and implemented by REEEP; Duration 2019 - 2024
- Targets the provision of sustainable clean energy services for underserved people in rural & peri-urban areas of Burkina Faso, Liberia, Mozambique & Zambia
- Expansion of a successful model in Zambia first financing round; Beyond the Grid Fund for Zambia (<u>https://www.bgfz.org/</u>)
- Market Creation injects public sector funding to overcome early structural challenges in the market, incentivize early-stage start-up and medium-term scale-up needs of Energy Service Providers and create conditions for long term sustainability & commercial investment



BGFA | TOP LEVEL OVERVIEW (CONT.)

- Open for expansion to other countries; dialog with interested countries already on-going
- Open to likeminded donors; dialog with German Development Bank KfW and other interested donors already ongoing
- Procurement Approach funding deployed as grants ("free-equity") in multi-year projects; subject to a rigorous RBF M&E approach
- Businesses will be expected to provide / demonstrate significant leverage
 - Equity & own funds (contributions in kind)
 - Co-funding (commercial and DFI sources)






BGFA | RELATIONSHIP WITH GOVERNMENT





- ► Total country budget SEK 200 million / USD 20 million
- Around USD 14 million available as direct funding to energy service providers
- Market Scoping supported by local consultant (Mr. Ngosa Mbolela and MARGE) in Lusaka Q3 & Q4 2019
- Cooperation & Coordination with KfW, the Southern Africa Energy Program (SAEP) and the Private Financing Advisory Network (PFAN)
- Dedicated BGFA Country Manager in 2020



BGFA | MARKET SCOPING

The following market sectors and aspects are addressed:

- Solar home systems (SHS / household solar)
- Mini-grids
- Bio-energy and improved cooking
- Remote areas and affordability
- Productive assets
- Energy efficiency (EE)
- Gender



BGFA | TOP LEVEL TIMELINE

- Q3 2019 Q1/Q2 2020 Market Scoping
- Sept 2019 Stakeholder Workshop
- Q1/Q2 2020 Finalisation of recommendations to BGFA Steering Committee for country funding windows & approaches
- Q2 2020 Detailed Programme & Procurement Design
- Q3 2020 Launch of Call for Proposals
- Q1 2021 First disbursements



BGFA | GLOBAL OUTCOMES

- ▶ Reaching 5 10 million people in rural and peri-urban areas in the target countries
- ▶ USD 50 100 million of public finance invested
- ► USD 150 600 million of Private Finance leveraged
- >15 concessional or private investors supporting energy access
- Platforms for Market Change in 3 5 countries are self-sustaining, run by local actors and interacting with each other;
- Policy situation in the target countries more conducive for off-grid electrification
- Robust and effective data collection and analysis mechanisms and systems mainstreamed in target countries to inform better public and private investment in frontier markets
